We at St. Joseph's Primary School Queens Park are a faith based community which strives to recognise and respond to the image of Christ in us all, as we grow together in work and prayer.



<u>Rationale</u>: At St. Joseph's School we recognise the important role Sport plays in the development of our students. We place a strong emphasis on participation and sportsmanship. The purpose of this code of conduct is to provide our students, parents and wider community members with some guidelines on our expectations of them at school sporting events.

**Students:** At sporting events we expect our students to:

- Actively participate.
- Try their best.
- Encourage others.
- Demonstrate good sportsmanship.
- Listen to the teachers/coaches.
- Represent the school with pride.

**Parents**: At sporting events we expect our parents to:

- Encourage all students.
- Show school pride.
- Refrain from placing pressure on their children to win.
- Refrain from using inappropriate language.
- Act in a respectful manner towards all teachers, umpires, students and community members whether they are associated with our school or not.

Failure to adhere to these 'Code of Conduct' guidelines may result in students being withdrawn from sporting activities and parents being asked not to attend future events.



ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL ADMIN: The term is travelling along nicely and I am enjoying every day in the computer lab with the students. They are always excited to get there and get stuck into whatever task we have prepared. Up to Year 3, each lesson begins with 10 minutes of typing practice. NAPLAN will be online in 2019 and therefore it is important that we give the students the time to get up to speed with this important skill. If you have a laptop or desktop computer at home, perhaps give your child some time to practise their typing skills. There are many useful online typing websites but the one I recommend the most is BBC Dance Mat Typing. This is free and easy for the students to use. We use this at school, however I am soon moving across to a new program called Typing Tournament. We have just purchased a license to use this software in the school and all students up to Year 6 will soon be using this platform.

**BEE BOTS:** As I mentioned two weeks ago, Bee Bots are small programmable floor robots that we have purchased for use in Pre Primary to Year 3. The students got to work with these for the first time over the past week and as you can see from the pictures they had a blast. As well as being very engaging and fun for the students, working with these robots involves a number of different subject areas including Science, Maths and Coding. We will be using these regularly over the course of the year.





**CONSTABLE CARE:** The Constable Care Child Safety Foundation provide schools with free interactive plays that deal with relevant issues such as bullying, well-being and cyber safety. We are fortunate to have been able to secure a booking for Week 4 of next term. Students from Years 4 to 6 will take part in two interactive plays on the one day. The first, called 'Frenemies' encourages students to think about how their behaviour can affect other people and helps them build confidence in social situations, make friends and develop resilience. The second, called 'Screen Name' teaches young people about the more serious danger of the cyber world and how to make safe decisions online. We look forward to having Constable Care at our school and hope it will increase our students' awareness of bullying and cyber safety issues.

# **SOCIAL WORKER NEWS:**

**LISTENING:** Of all the communication skills, listening is the most demanding and the least mastered skill. The ancient philosopher Zeno is quoted as saying, "We have been given two ears and but a single mouth, in order that we may listen more and talk less."

First of all, we must **want** to listen. When a young boy hears his mother say, "Take out the rubbish," he is suddenly deaf. He does not want to hear that. But when she just whispers, "Here's a dollar; go and get yourself an ice cream," he picks up the softest signal loud and clear. To listen we must **pay** attention. That implies that it costs something. And it does. In listening we pay out our most personal and intimate treasures - our awareness, our interest, and our effort in order to **receive** something in return; a meaning, information, understanding, or perhaps comfort or entertainment.

Listening is hard **work**, which is why we do not give our attention indiscriminately. Above all, listening is a **gift**. It has been described as one of the greatest gifts we can give each other. Listening requires the use of learned **skills**. Listening is the communication skill learned first and used most often. Yet, of all the communication skills, it is the least taught and least mastered and yet probably the most valuable.
