5. Chairperson's Report

Good evening, everyone and welcome to the 2022 Annual Community Meeting of St Joseph's School. My name is Mary Waikari and I have had the honour of serving as the Chairperson of the School Advisory Council this year. I'd like to begin by acknowledging the Traditional Owners of the land on which we meet today, the Whadjuk Ngoongar people and pay my respects to Elders past, present, and emerging. On behalf of the School Advisory Council, I would like to thank you for attending tonight and for your support of our school community.

The role of the School Advisory Council is to bring the voice of the community into the school and contribute to building a Catholic culture,

and to support the principal and leadership with an advisory role in the financial management of the school. This year, in line with the new constitution, we met once per term – the first meeting taking place via Teams due to covid. The School Advisory Council has worked closely with John Rose on several major projects, striving to improve and benefit the school. On behalf of the School Advisory Council, I would like to thank John for his continued hard work and effort throughout the year.

The derelict house near the kindy carpark was demolished at the beginning of last year. After some re-zoning delays, this area was converted into a staff carpark in 2022, which has definitely helped to ease the congestion in the mornings and afternoons.

In the middle of the year, the carpets in years 4, 5 and 6, and the vinyl in the middle classrooms were replaced. The carpets in the downstairs classrooms (Years 1, 2 and 3) will be replaced in 2023. This fresh update looks great and the vinyl in the shared spaces is much more user friendly.

One other project that is currently underway is the plexipaving of the sports courts. Not only will this update look great but will be a much better surface for the children to play and compete on.

The P&F have been responsible for more great fundraisers this year, as well as the morning teas, and coffee drives. These events all contribute to the school's wonderful culture of community and togetherness, whilst raising much needed and valued funds for a variety of causes. Their \$10,000 contribution towards Home Readers and Literacy Pro this year is very much appreciated. Thank you to Kirsty, Stu and all of the P&F for all of your hard work throughout 2022. We look forward to the Family Fun Night on Friday. I am sure that the addition of amusement rides this year is going to be a huge hit for everyone who attends.

To the staff of St Joseph's School, thank you for another wonderful year. We recognise and greatly appreciate the hard work, love and care that you show all of the children at our school. On behalf of the parents, I thank you!

6. **Principal's Report**

I would like to thank Fr Peter for his spiritual leadership. Thank you, Fr Peter, for over 40 years' service to the Queens Park Norbertine community. On the 9 December there will be a mass to celebrate 40 years' service as a priest in Queens Park. This is a very rare feat, and I would like to publicly thank Fr Peter for his long commitment to our school and the parish.

We have had our challenges in 2022 as we have transitioned from our borders being closed, isolation periods changing and now living with COVID. I would like to thank our whole staff for adapting to various conditions but always having the needs of the students as a priority.

I would like to say thanks to our leadership team which in 2022 we had Ms Bowen and Mrs Tomlinson who have supported the St Joseph's community. Thanks to Bec and Lynn for your expertise and wisdom, it has been greatly appreciated by everyone.

In 2022 St Joseph's again comfortably performed above the Australian Standard in all ten areas assessed in NAPLAN. This is a credit to all staff from PK – Yr 6 and to all students and families.

In 2022 the School Advisory Council looked at major capital expenditure items in the carpark which was recently completed. These extra bays have reduced congestion and will be particularly beneficial during construction of the overhead rail line in 2023. We have planned to complete plex paving the basketball courts which will now be partially completed in 2022 and finalised in 2023. In 2022 new carpets were laid in Yr 4-6 with Yr 1-3 classrooms being completed in 2023.

I would also like to recognise and thank our administration staff who have had to continue to be agile with COVID.
